ABOUT THE D-8 FORUM ON SMEs AND HEALTH MARKET

It is a well-established fact that the Small and Medium Scale Enterprises (SMEs) are significant in driving economic growth, development, and job creation in the D-8 Member States. According to the International Finance Cooperation, MSMEs account for a large percentage of all businesses in the D8 markets and as such, remain one of the main sources of employment. The SMEs have remained even more resilient after facing unprecedented economic disruptions in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic and are optimistic about the growth that lies ahead. - Visa Requirement: Participants that come from a country that needs a visa are required to apply and obtain a visa from Nigerian Embassy/High Commission in country of resident before boarding an inbound aircraft to Nigeria. Requirements Your national passport must always be carried on official travel. Please ensure your Passport is valid for at least six months and has at least two blank pages to facilitate immigration stamps.
- Covid-19: The Nigerian government requires all passengers traveling to Nigeria (including Nigerians) to have one of the following: A negative PCR test certificate for COVID-19, taken no more than 72 hours before their flight departure time.
 Passengers must present paper copies of their test results with a QR code. A COVID-19 vaccine certificate issued by an



- accredited laboratory in the issuing country, containing a QR code. Vaccinated passengers must have received a full course of one of the following in Nigeria: AstraZeneca, Johnson, and Johnson, Moderna, Pfizer, Sinopharm,
- · Sinovac, or Sputnik V.
